## Bishop's Message

Hi Ward Family,

To all those noble fathers living the dream of responsible fatherhood, happy father's day. No easy task, but truly rewarding nonetheless. Elder James. E. Faust said *"Noble fatherhood gives us a glimpse of the divine."*

Yet today the media and movies portray men inappropriately as uninterested, disloyal or distracted. We only need to turn to the "Family Proclamation" and the scriptures for our guidance.

It states in the family proclamation. *"By divine design, fathers are to preside over their families in love and righteousness and are responsible to provide the necessities of life and the protection for their family."* The proclamation also notes, *"...fathers and mothers are obligated to help each other as equal partners"*.

And in the new testament we read a snapshot of the Savior's relationship with Heavenly Father: *"Jesus kneeled down, and prayed, saying, Father, if thou be willing, remove this cup from me: nevertheless not my will, but thine, be done.
