Bishop's Message

Hi Ward Family,

After much anticipation, we will shortly receive instruction from the First Presidency and other General Authorities at General Conference this weekend. As stated by President Nelson, in his closing remarks in October 2019 conference, this conference “will be different from any previous conference”. That statement is certainly living up to expectation with no 20,000 plus congregation attending, no live choir, and no grand view of the conference center. But I know despite this, the messages and spirit will remain unchanged.

May I encourage everyone to take up President Nelson's invitation to prepare for the conference by studying Joseph Smith's First Vision account and to ponder questions like: “How would my life be different if my knowledge gained from the Book of Mormon were suddenly taken away?” or “How have the events that followed the First Vision made a difference for me and my loved ones?” The more prepared we are the more we will gain from the inspired words that have prayerfully been crafted over months by those preparing to speak.

On the matter of sacrament in the home, this week I received news from the Area Presidency that due to the risks of contracting COVID-19 the sacrament will no longer be possible in the homes without Priesthood already present. I know this decision was not made lightly by the Area Presidency and complies with the recent government restrictions of home visitation. May I encourage those homes affected by this adjustment to read the sacrament prayer pondering the sacred promises (Moroni 4:3 & 5:2).

The Area Presidency has also provided further instruction on the uses of chapels.

- Chapels are not to be used at all, with the exception of missionaries (1 companionship at a time, one hour limit, on P-days only).
- Priesthood leaders will not be able to interview members at the chapel.

I hope and pray in light of these further adjustments we continue to stay in touch with each other using inventive means and technology in line with government and church recommendations. We have shared two such events below. First, our Seminary students and a welcome home drive-by for Elder King.

3- What important lesson did you learn?

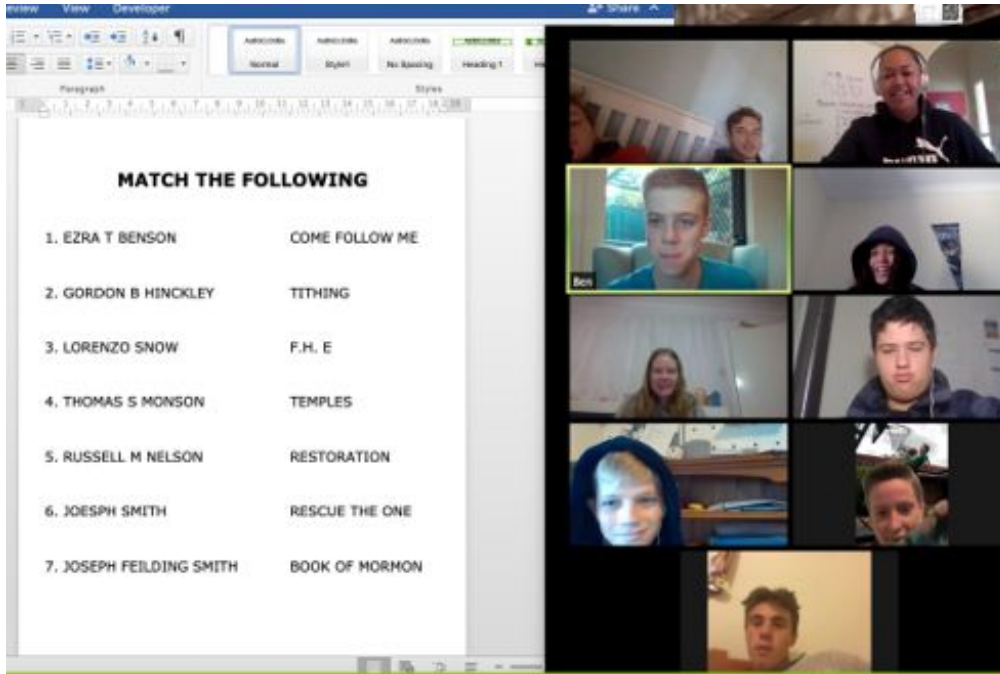
Don't be scared to share the gospel, even to people you don't think will be interested. You never know where or who it might lead you to.

Primary

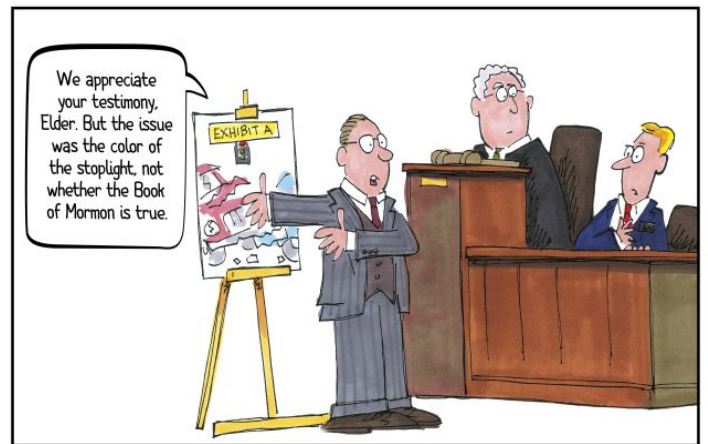
